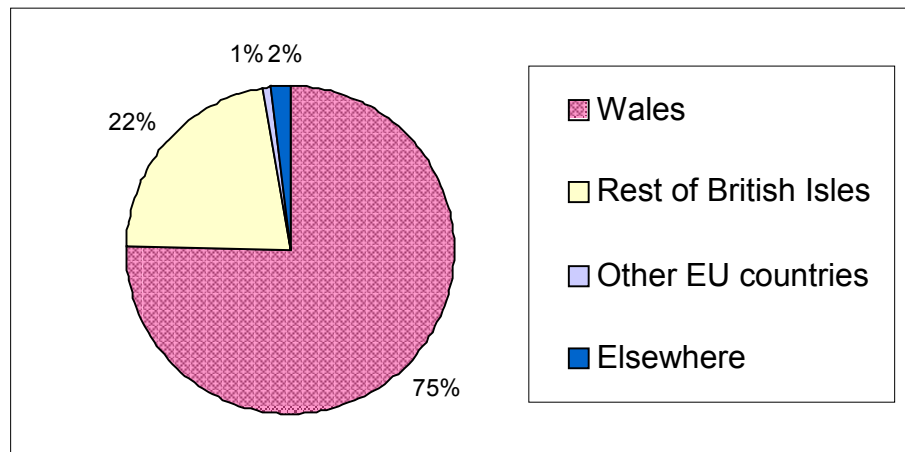

2001 CENSUS OF POPULATION: FIRST RESULTS ON COUNTRY OF BIRTH

Background

The census question asked: What is your country of birth? - answered by ticking one of six boxes, for five specific countries (Wales, England, Scotland, Northern Ireland and Republic of Ireland) and Elsewhere (with the country being written in). The Census results show the proportion of the resident population according to these countries and whether in another EU country or elsewhere (see table 1).

Main results



- 75 per cent - or some 2,188,800 people - resident in Wales were born in Wales; the equivalent proportion in the 1991 census was 77 per cent
- 22 per cent (some 634,800 people) were born elsewhere in the British Isles, the majority (some 589,800 people) in England
- Less than 1 per cent - or some 23,700 people - stated that they were born in 'Other EU countries' whilst just under 2 per cent - or some 55,900 people - stated 'Elsewhere'

Local authority data - table 2

- local authority areas with the highest proportion of their population born in Wales were mainly in the south. Of those, Blaenau Gwent and Merthyr Tydfil had the highest proportion with 92 per cent each. In comparison Flintshire had the lowest proportion with 51 per cent.
- overall, people born in 'Other EU countries' or 'Elsewhere' comprised just less than 3 per cent of the Welsh population. Corresponding figures for the majority of the 22 local authorities were around 3 per cent or lower. However, Cardiff and Newport were the exceptions with just under 7 and 4 per cent respectively. These two authorities also have the highest concentration of ethnic minorities though many will have been born in this country.

Comparison with 1991 Census data^(a) - table 3 and chart 1

- for the majority of the local authorities the proportion of people born in Wales according to the 1991 Census was equal to or higher than the corresponding figures from the 2001 Census. The exceptions were Denbighshire, Conwy and Torfaen.
- the authorities showing the greatest difference in the proportions, between 1991 and 2001, were Ceredigion (from 64 per cent to 59 per cent) and Powys (from 60 per cent to 56 per cent).
- the local authority in 1991 with the highest proportion of its population born in Wales was Blaenau Gwent (93 per cent), as in 2001, whilst the authorities with the lowest proportions were Flintshire and Conwy (53 per cent).

(a) The 1991 Census counted students at their home address, whereas the 2001 Census counted them at their term time address. Hence when comparing 1991 and 2001 Census data the 'student' effect for the local authorities with residential colleges needs to be taken into consideration though it cannot be quantified.
